EIU Heads To UT Martin For Rescheduled Game

Eastern Illinois at UT Martin Graham Stadium (7,500) • Martin, Tenn. March 7, 2021 • 1 p.m. • TV: ESPN+

NOTES TO KNOW

- Running back Kendi Young broke loose for a 72-yard touchdown run late in the second quarter against Southeast Missouri. He became just the 21st player in school history with a rushing touchdown of 70 yards or more. The last to join the list was Malik Harrison with an 83-yard scamper on Oct. 24, 2015 against Tennessee Tech. Young finished the game 88 yards on the ground on just 11 carries. He ranks third in the NCAA in yards per carry and is 15th in the nation in rushing yards per game.
- Matt Judd returned five kickoffs for 112 yards to average 22.4 yards per return which is currently 17th in the NCAA. Judd's long return of the day was 39 yards. Judd is a transfer wide receiver from Illinois who joined the program in January of 2020. He is 26th in the NCAA in all-purpose yards.
- Sophomore corner JJ Ross picked up where he left off last season in defending passes as he finished with five solo tackles, two pass break-ups and a fumble recovery. Ross ranks fourth in the NCAA in passes defended. Last season he earned Freshman All-American honors leading the team with four interceptions including two in the final game of the season at Austin Peay.
- Senior corner Mark Williams had a pass break-up to go along with three tackles in the season opener. The pass break-up was the 20th of his career as he needs one more this season to move into a tie for 9th on the EIU career list with Antoine Johnson and Jeff Mills. In addition to his 20 pass break-ups, Williams has six career interceptions including one returned for a touchdown at Indiana State his freshman season.
- Eastern Illinois and UT Martin are both looking for their first win of the season as the two teams meet on Sunday in a game rescheduled from the opening weekend (Feb. 21) due to winter weather. EIU lost to No. 21 Southeast Missouri in the opener while UT Martin lost at Murray State.

- Senior Raymond Crittenden picked up the season where he ended it last year as he tied for the team lead in tackles with nine against Southeast Missouri. Crittenden made six solo tackles which ranks 15th in the NCAA while adding 1.5 tackles for loss. Last season Crittenden was fourth on the team with 56 tackles including 3.5 tackles for loss. In the Panthers game at UT Martin he added a fumble recovery for touchdown (51 yards).
- Linebacker Anthony Shockey made his third career start last Sunday against Southeast Missouri. Shockey responded with nine tackles and two tackles for loss as he was tied for game high honors in both statistics. He is 34th in the NCAA in tackles and 14th in tackles for loss. Last season Shockey made his first career start against Illinois State and also had a start against Murray State. As a true freshman he finished with 32 tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss.
- Freshman Jordan Miles was effective up front as the Panthers trotted out a young group of defensive linemen. Miles had three tackles in the game including two tackles for loss which rank him 14th in the NCAA in that category. He was one of two first year players for the Panthers that finished with tackles for loss as linebacker Phoenix Porter made two tackles, one for loss.
- Eastern Illinois may have one of the youngest rosters in terms of experience as 77 of the 102 players are underclassmen. Of those, 50 are freshmen or redshirt freshmen that may have played up to four games in 2019. From that group four true freshmen started on the defense against Southeast Missouri with Jaron Hacha and Michael Young Jr., up front; while Kaelin Drakeford and Jordan Vincent started at the safety positions.
- Eastern Illinois defense had one takeaway against Southeast Missouri as Kaelin Drakeford forced a fumble in the second quarter that was picked up by JJ Ross. EIU is 36th in the NCAA this season in turnovers gained. Last season EIU ranked 39th in the nation with 21 turnovers gained. The Panthers had 11 interceptions and ten fumble recoveries in 2019.
- Eastern Illinois defense finished with five pass break-ups on Sunday against Southeast Missouri. JJ Ross had two while Jordan Vincent, Tim Varga and Mark Williams all finished with one. EIU's season high for pass break-ups in 2019 was six against Tennessee Tech. The Panthers added five pass break-up games against Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri.
- Despite a young group on the defensive side of the ball, Eastern Illinois finished with eight tackles for loss against Southeast Missouri, that total ranks 15th in the FCS. Anthony Shockey and Jordan Miles each had two tackles for loss as six total players collected TFL's in the game. Last season EIU averaged 7.1 tackles for loss per game with a high of nine against both Tennessee Tech and Murray State.
- EIU held Southeast Missouri to just 35 percent on third down conversions on Sunday as the Redhawks were 3-of-13 in the game. The Panthers rank 18th in the FCS in 3rd down defense this season. Last year opponents converted at a 39 percent rate on 3rd down as EIU ranked 77th in the FCS in 3rd down defense.
- Last season Eastern Illinois led the FCS in fourth down attempts and fourth down conversions going 28-of-51. On Sunday against Southeast Missouri, the Panthers went for it on fourth down again finishing 0-of-5 for the afternoon.

2019 OVC Players of the Week

- Harry Woodbery will enter his third year in the Eastern Illinois football program and is on the verge of cracking the Panthers career Top 10 in a pair of categories. Woodbery entered the season ranked 12th on the EIU career touchdown passes list with 23. He needs two to join the Top 10. Woodbery entered the season ranked 15th in career passing yards. He currently has with 3,107 career passing yards and needs 716 yards this season to crack the Top 10.
- Last season Eastern Illinois ranked 119th in the NCAA in kickoff returns averaging 15.7 yards per return. After the first game of this season, EIU has moved up to rank 15th in the nation averaging 22.4 yards per kick return. Matt Judd served as the primary kick returner in the season opener.
- Eastern Illinois offensive line did a good job of protecting the quarterback and allowing runners to get to the line against Southeast Missouri. The Panthers starting group of Cole Hoover, Ivan Gleyzer, Ben Solomon, Elkhanen Tanelus and Chad Strickland did not allow a sack in the contest. The last time EIU did not allow a sack in a game was Oct. 26, 2019 against Eastern Kentucky. EIU's offensive line allowed only three tackles for loss in the contest as well, the second lowest total in the NCAA.
- Freshman quarterback Otto Kuhns saw some time under center in the second half of the Panthers season opener with Southeast Missouri. Kuhns was 3-of-12 but did pass for 70 yards in those three completions. He had a long pass of 31 yards to super back Anthony Manaves.
- Eastern Illinois had All-OVC tight end/super back James Sheehan as a weapon last season. Following his graduation, the Panthers brought in Jay Vallie a graduate transfer from Dayton. In his debut Vallie caught three passes for 26 yards. He was one of three players at the Super Back position to catch a pass on Sunday joining Anthony Manaves and Nick Stricker.
- DeWayne Cooks Jr., was the Panthers top receiver in the season opener against Southeast Missouri as six different EIU players caught passes. Cooks had five catches for 62 yards and ranks 33rd in the NCAA in receptions per game. Last season Cooks played in ten games making 12 catches for 98 yards. His season best was four catches for 33 yards at Murray State.
- Senior offensive lineman Cole Hoover was selected as a 2020 Lincoln Student Laureate Award Winner which is presented to the top students representing Illinois' colleges and universities. Hoover will be a third year starter for the Panthers and has seen time at all three offensive line positions (center, guard & tackle). Hoover is majoring in Early Childhood Special Education and holds a 3.83 grade point average.
- Senior quarterback Harry Woodbery was a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy in the fall despite EIU not participating in football in 2020. Woodbery was one of two players from the Ohio Valley Conference (Blake Mitchell Austin Peay) to be selected as semifinalists for the award. He earned his Bachelor's Degree with a 3.70 grade point average in Philosophy and is currently enrolled in EIU's MBA program.

EIU HEAD COACH ADAM CUSHING

Adam Cushing was hired as the 25th head coach in Eastern Illinois football history on Dec. 9, 2018. A Chicago native, Cushing made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as the Panthers brought in more than 40 new players this season with a majority from the state of Illinois. Cushing came to EIU following a 15-year stint as an assistant coach at Northwestern where he coached the offensive line since 2009. UT MARTIN HEAD COACH JASON SIMPSON

Jason Simpson is currently the longest tenured head coach in the Ohio Valley Conference entering his 15th season with UT Martin. In his debut season of 2006, Simpson earned OVC Coach of the Year honors as he led the Skyhawks to a share of the OVC Championship and the school's first FCS Playoff appearance. He has posted a record of 87-74 with an OVC mark of 69-43. Last season he became UTM's career leader in coaching wins. Simpson is a 1995 graduate of Southern Mississippi where he played baseball.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN

UT Martin opened the season with a road loss at Murray State as the Racers picked up a 14-10 win. In the game UT Martin was held to just 210 yards of total offense including just 100 yards passing. John Bachus was held to 81 yards passing on 26 attempts with two interceptions. Coltn Dowell was the top receiving target for the day with seven catches for 81 yards. On the ground, the Skyhawks were led by Peyton Logan with 91 yards. Devin Sims and John Ford both collected seven tackles to lead UTM.

THE SERIES

Eastern Illinois and UT Martin will be meeting for the 26th time as the two schools play in Martin, Tenn., for the second straight season. UTM won during the Oct. 2019 meeting holding off the Panthers, 27-18. EIU won the previous season in Charleston, 24-21 in overtime. EIU's last win at Graham Stadium was on Nov. 14, 2015 as the Panthers provided some stellar fourth quarter defense in a 23-21 win.

SHUT OUT STREAK ENDS

Eastern Illinois had a 139 game streak of not being shut out in a game end Sept. 12, 2015 at Northwestern during 41-0 loss. The last time EIU had been shut out was Oct. 11, 2003 during a 41-0 loss versus Eastern Kentucky. In the 2015 season opener EIU had its streak of consecutive games scoring a touchdown end at 65 after the Panthers were held out of the end zone. The last time EIU had failed to score a touchdown was October 10, 2009 at Penn State. EIU's longest streak of consecutive games without being shutout was 197 from 1977-1997 which ranks fourth all-time among FCS schools.

OVC SUCCESS
