Panthers Kick Off 2021 With Week Zero Game At Indiana State

Eastern Illinois at Indiana State

Memorial Stadium (12,764) • Terre Haute, Ind.

NOTES TO KNOW

- Eastern Illinois gets an early start to the 2021 season as the Panthers travel to Terre Haute, Ind., on Saturday night to face Indiana State in a Week Zero contest. The game is one of two FCS Week Zero contests and one of seven total overall Week Zero games. For Indiana State it will be the Sycamores first game in 644 days as they opted out of the 2020-21 season. For EIU it will continue a span of 17 games in nine months as EIU played six games in the spring of 2021.
- Jason Johnson was named a preseason first team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection after earning first team All-OVC honors last season at linebacker. The third year player led the OVC in tackles per game last season finishing the year with 66 tackles. His 11 tackles per game ranked ninth in the FCS. Johnson ended the season with a streak of four straight games with double figure tackles including 15 against Tennessee Tech.
- Matt Judd was named a preseason first team All-Ohio Valley Conference selection at kick returner. Last season he earned second team honors at the position leading the OVC in kick return average at 24.8 yards per return. Judd had a long return on the season of 53 yards at UT Martin. Judd also sees time at wide receiver hauling in eight passes for 109 yards and a touchdown in six games last season.
- The August 28 kickoff date marks the earliest calendar date EIU has ever opened a football season. This is the fourth time the EIU has played a season opener on August 28. The last time was in 2014 at Minnesota. EIU also has played Aug. 28 openers in 2008 at Central Michigan and 1997 at Western Illinois.
- Eastern Illinois scored 13 offensive touchdowns during its shortened spring 2021 season. Of those 13 scores, three were of the big play variety with two long touchdown runs and one pass play. DeWayne Cooks hauled in a 45-yard touchdown pass for one score. Kendi Young had a 72-yard touchdown run in the opener and the final score was an 80-yard touchdown run.

- Eastern Illinois added a pair of NCAA Division II All-American transfers to the roster during the offseason with both players expected to provide an impact this season. Logen Neidhardt was a two-time All-American at punter in 2018 and 2019 at Ohio Dominican. He opted of playing in 2020. Justin Growel was an All-American at Lake Erie College in 2019 when he was a nominee for the Cliff Harris Award as a defensive lineman. The award is presented to the top small school defensive player in college football.
- Quarterback Otto Kuhns has been listed as the starter for the Week Zero game at Indiana State. Kuhns appeared in four games last making three starts. He finished the year passing for 509 yards and five touchdowns going 44-of-87 (50.6 pct). Kuhns added 86 yards rushing on the ground with a long run of 22 yards.
- Otto Kuhns will have company in the quarterback room as the Panthers brought in two FBS transfers and a high school quarterback to join Kuhns and Zach Weir. Chris Katrenick is a transfer from Duke where he appeared in eight games during a four-year career with the Blue Devils. Grant Ciccarone is a transfer from Colorado while Zach Trainor is a high school product from Michigan.
- Dynamic wide receiver Isaiah Hill is expected to return to the Panthers line-up this season after missing all of last year with an injury. In 2019 Hill earned All-OVC Newcomer Team honors as he led the Panthers in receiving with 58 catches for 571 yards in eight games played. He scored six touchdowns on the season with four receiving and two rushing.
- With Isaiah Hill out last season, EIU had three players finish with double figure receptions last season led by Univ. of Dayton transfer Jay Vallie. Playing the super back position he hauled in 18 passes for 190 yards and three touchdowns. Vallie will sit out this season due to injury. The Panthers two top returning receiving threats are DeWayne Cooks (15 catches / 241 yards) and Tyler Hamilton (13 catches / 80 yards).
- Eastern Illinois added some transfer depth at the wide receiver position as the Panthers brought in Tyler Ringwood from UNC Charlotte and Adarius Dent from Florida State. Ringwood caught 36 passes for 540 yards and three touchdowns in three seasons at Charlotte. He was the team's third leading receiver when the 49ers made a bowl game in 2019. Dent transferred to EIU during fall camp from FSU. He made three catches in two seasons seeing a good deal of his playing time on special teams.
- EIU returns two of its top three rushers from last season with Jaelin Benefield and Kendi Young. Benefield was second on the team with 258 yards rushing after leading the Panthers as a true freshman in 2019. Young was third on the team with 121 yards appearing in just three games. Benefield also added nine receptions out of the backfield.
- EIU added some size and experience to its running back corps with transfer Markenzy Pierre and freshman Harrison Bey-Buie. Pierre is a transfer from Syracuse where he had 59 carries over the past four seasons playing for former EIU head coach Dino Babers. Bey-Buie is in his second season as a Panther after missing the COVID-19 season due to injury. As a senior in high school he rushed for more than 2,000 yards and 32 touchdowns to be named a finalist for the All-Iowa football player of the year.
- Eastern Illinois returns four of its five starters on the offensive line from last season with all four players starting as a unit for all six games. Ivan Gleyzer (RG), Ben Solomon (C), Elkhanan Tanelus (LG) and Chad Strickland (LT) started with departed senior Cole Hoover. Solomon, Tanelus and Strickland all started during the 2019 season as well giving the Panthers a veteran unit heading into 2021.
- Ben Solomon has been named a nominee for this year's Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Solomon is one of three nominee's from the Ohio Valley Conference and 17 players from the FCS ranks. Solomon has been a leader for the Panthers Uplifting Athletes Chapter spearheading two campaigns over the last two summers (Walk for Life & Lift for Life).

Eastern Illinois Players On All-OVC Preseason Team

Jason Johnson - Linebacker Matt Judd - Kick Returner

2020 OVC Players of the Week (Played in Spring of 2021)

March 23 - Jason Johnson (Defense) March 30 - Jordan Smith (Newcomer)

- Linebacker Colin Bohanek came on strong at the end of last season as he finished second on the team in tackles as a true freshman. Bohanek had 40 tackles for the season with two tackles for loss. One of his biggest plays of the season came in the home win over Tennessee Tech as he intercepted a pass late in the fourth quarter to seal the victory. Bohanek ranked first among OVC freshmen in tackles last season.
- Eastern Illinois defense ranked fifth in the Ohio Valley Conference last season in tackles for loss and did most of that with a young front line. True freshmen Jordan Miles, Michael Young Jr., and Jaron Hacha combined to start ten games up front with all three starting together in one game. Miles would finish the season tied for the team lead in tackles for loss with six and was the team leader in sacks with two.
- Eastern Illinois pressure on the quarterback last season came from its younger players as five of the team's six sacks were collected by true freshmen. Jordan Miles led the team with two sacks. Colin Bohanek added 1.5 sacks with fellow linebacker Phoenix Porter collecting one sack. Safety Kaelin Drakeford was credited with a half sack.
- Eastern Illinois defense had one fumble recovery in its final game of the 2020-21 season against Jacksonville State as the Panthers had ten turnovers gained to rank 26th in the FCS. EIU has a streak of 16 straight games of forcing at least one turnover. The last time EIU didn't force a turnover in a game was Sept. 14, 2019 against Illinois State. In that 16 game span, two of those turnovers have been converted into touchdowns with an interception return for touchdown and fumble return for a score.
- EIU's defense will have two new starters at corner when the Panthers open the season at Indiana State. One of the two open spots is that of second team All-OVC corner Mark Williams who graduated in the spring. EIU has four players that have been battling for time during fall camp with junior college transfer Russell Dandy and second year player Tyris Harvey currently listed as starters. Central Florida transfer Elijah Benoit and returner Charles Shelton IV are also in the mix.
- Last season EIU started two true freshmen at the safety positions with Kaelin Drakeford and Jordan Vincent. The two combined for 61 tackles ranking third and sixth on the team in total tackles. This fall EIU will welcome back Bryce Dewberry who was a starter at safety in 2019 and missed last season with an injury as the Panthers have built some depth at the position.
- Eastern Illinois special teams had a knack for blocking kicks last season as the Panthers blocked two punts and a field goal during the six game season. The blocked field goal came against Jacksonville State with blocked punts at UT Martin and Tennessee Tech. The UT Martin punt was blocked by DeAirious Smith and resulted in a safety. The TTU blocked punt by Marcus Bornslater was recovered for a touchdown.
- EIU split its kicking duties last season and looks to do so again this year. Stone Galloway served as the field goal kicker going 5-of-7 on field goal attempts with a long of 44 yards. Will Orth served as the place kicker on extra points and handled most of the kickoff duties.
- Over the last two seasons Eastern Illinois has been aggressive in terms of going for it on 4th down, in fact EIU ranks first in the FCS in fourth down attempts in the last two seasons with 82. The Panthers have converted on 38 of those 82 fourth down attempts good for 46.3 percent. The Citadel (47 conversions) and Davidson (43 conversions) are the only schools with more fourth down conversions in the last two seasons.
- Eastern Illinois ranked second in the FCS in kickoff return defense last season as opponents only averaged 10.2 yards per return against the Panthers
- Eastern Illinois led the OVC in fewest penalty yards per game last season as the Panthers ranked 5th in the FCS with only 31.1 penalty yards per game flagged against them.

EIU HEAD COACH ADAM CUSHING

Adam Cushing was hired as the 25th head coach in Eastern Illinois football history on Dec. 9, 2018. A Chicago native, Cushing made an immediate impact on the recruiting trail as the Panthers brought in more than 40 new players that first season with a majority from the state of Illinois. Cushing came to EIU following a 15-year stint as an assistant coach at Northwestern where he coached the offensive line since 2009. INDIANA STATE HEAD COACH CURT MALLORY

Curt Mallory, the son of former long time college coach Bill Mallory, enters his fifth season at Indiana State. Mallory posted a 12-22 record in his first three seasons with the Sycamores opting out of the 2020-21 season with COVID-19 concerns. After going 0-11 in his first season the Sycamores improved to 7-4 in year two as he won MVFC Coach of the Year honors. The team was 5-7 during the 2019 campaign. Mallory played football at Michigan and had assistant coaching stops at Indiana, Illinois and Michigan before taking over in Terre Haute.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE

Indiana State returns to action after not playing football in 644 calendar days. The Sycamores last played on Nov. 23, 2019 after missing all of 2020-21 due to COVID-19. Despite the long layoff the Sycamores return several key figures from their 2019 roster including quarterback Kurtis Wilderman and top running back Peterson Kerlegrand and top receiver Dante Hendrix. The ISU defense lost some players but does return Kaleb Brewer and Inoke Moala who both posted double figure tackles for loss in 2019.

THE SERIES

Eastern Illinois and Indiana State will be meeting for the 87th time when the two schools, separated by just 45 miles, open the year with a Week Zero Game on Aug. 28 in Terre Haute. Eastern Illinois leads the all-time series between the two schools 43-39-4. Indiana State has won the last two games in the series including a 2019 meeting in EIU head coach Adam Cushing's first season in Charleston. The two schools first met on the gridiron in 1902 with this the second most played series in EIU program history (trailing only the Mid-America Classic with Illinois State).

SHUT OUT STREAK ENDS

Eastern Illinois had a 139 game streak of not being shut out in a game end Sept. 12, 2015 at Northwestern during 41-0 loss. The last time EIU had been shut out was Oct. 11, 2003 during a 41-0 loss versus Eastern Kentucky. In the 2015 season opener EIU had its streak of consecutive games scoring a touchdown end at 65 after the Panthers were held out of the end zone. The last time EIU had failed to score a touchdown was October 10, 2009 at Penn State. EIU's longest streak of consecutive games without being shutout was 197 from 1977-1997 which ranks fourth alltime among FCS schools.

OVC SUCCESS

Eastern Illinois was the OVC's most successful school in terms of wins during the first decade of the 2000's as the Panthers posted 72 wins during that span. EIU leads the conference with the most post-season appearances since the Panthers joined the league in 1996.


