Season Opener For EIU In Terre Haute

Eastern Illinois at Indiana State Memorial Stadium (12,700) • Terre Haute, Ind. August 31, 2023 • 5 p.m. • TV: ESPN+

NOTES TO KNOW

- Eastern Illinois will open its 118th season of football on Thursday night when the Panthers travel to Terre Haute to face Indiana State. The series between the Panthers and Sycamores is the second most played in EIU program history with the schools first meeting in 1901. They have played 87 times, the last meeting in 2021 for the season opener. The two schools have played in EIU's season opener 27 times including every season between 1956-1970. ISU leads in those contests 15-11-1.
- The Big South Conference and Ohio Valley Conference have entered into a four-year agreement to play as the Big South-OVC Football Association. As part of that initial merger between the two leagues a preseason list of players to watch was released at the conference media day in late July. Eastern Illinois had ten players featured on that list, second most among the ten league schools. Selected to the preseason watch list were Chad Strickland (OT), Juwon Farri (RB), Justin Thomas (WR), Elijawah Tolbert (LB), Nick Coates (NICK), Russell Dandy (DB), Stone Galloway (K), Mark Aitken (KR), Cooper Willman (PR) and Jack Valente (LS).
- Kicker Stone Galloway was named to the preseason watch list for the Fred Mitchell Award which is presented to the top non-FBS kicker in the nation. Galloway was a first-team All-OVC selection last year going 11-of-12 on field goals and 27-of-27 on extra points. Galloway led the Panthers in scoring with 60 points, his second straight season ranking as the team's leading scorer. The senior enters the season with 24 career field goals which is seventh on the EIU career list.
- Eastern Illinois returns its top four receivers in terms of receptions and yards from last season. Nile Hill was the Panthers leader last year with 26 catches for 239 yards and two touchdowns. Justin Thomas finished the season second on the team with 17 catches for 210 yards and two scores. He was among the FCS national leaders prior to a season ending injury in game four. Cooper Willman (16 rec / 199 yds) and Justin Bowick (13 rec / 250 yds / 3 TD) round out the list.
- Elijawah Tolbert returns as the Panthers leading tackler from last season with 70 tackles which ranked third on the EIU roster and 12th in the OVC. Tolbert is the third leading tackler among OVC returning players this year and sixth among returners from the combined leagues.

- Eastern Illinois lost its top three rushers from last season's roster and a total of 1,181 of the teams 1,642 total rushing yards (72 percent). The Panthers top returning ground gainers are Kendi Young (280 yards) and MJ Flowers (118 yards). To help fill the gap EIU hit the transfer portal bringing in a pair of former All-American rushers in Juwon Farri and Kevin Daniels. Farri was the 2020 Big South Offensive Player of the Year at Monmouth and rushed for 2,482 career yards in five seasons at the New Jersey based school. Daniels was a freshman All-American in 2021 and rushed for 1,283 yards in three seasons at Northern Arizona.
- Quarterback Jonah O'Brien returns this season after starting eight games last season and passing for 853 yards with eight touchdowns. O'Brien missed the last part of the season due to injury so the Panthers added depth at that position. Pierce Holley and Terrance Gipson both joined the program in the spring and are locked into a battle with O'Brien for the starting spot. Holley is a transfer from Georgetown who earned second team All-Patriot League honors passing for 4,142 yards over the last two seasons with the Hoyas. Gipson, a former quarterback at SMU, comes to EIU after a standout season at East Los Angeles College passing for 1,776 yards and rushing for another 401.
- Tre'jon Lewis came on strong late in the season for the Panthers defense finishing the season with 25 tackles including a team-high 7.5 tackles for loss which was tied for 10th in the OVC last season. As a team last season EIU had 68 tackles for loss with 16 sacks. Joel Barrows returns as the Panthers leader in sacks with three last year.
- Eastern Illinois has added some experienced depth to its defensive front with Alex Alteus, Zed Asowata, and Nicholas Oliviera-Chace. Alteus played the last three years at Stetson after opening his career at UNC Pembroke. Alteus played in 18 games the last two years at Stetson with 51 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss. Asowata played four years at Midwestern State appearing in 32 games. He collected 83 tackles with 13 tackles for loss, six sacks and four forced fumbles. Oliviera-Chace comes to EIU following two seasons at Franklin Pierce University where he had 78 tackles, seven tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks.
- Eastern Illinois ranked 29th in the FCS in turnovers gained last season with 20 which included 13 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries. The 13 interceptions were 16th in the FCS with four EIU players picking off at least two passes. Elijawah Tolbert is the Panthers top returner for interceptions with three while returning defensive back Tyris Harvey had two picks last year.
- Eastern Illinois scored both a special teams and defensive touchdown last season as the Panthers have scored at least one of each every season dating back to 2016. Last season EIU's defensive score came against Lindenwood with a Alexandar Oyawale 40-yard fumble return for touchdown. The special teams touchdown came against Tennessee Tech with a Mark Aitken 65-yard blocked field goal return for touchdown. During the 2021 season EIU had three combined defensive/special teams touchdowns with DeAirious Smith scoring on a blocked punt return and Tyris Harvey returning an interception for touchdown. Current student assistant coach Bryce Dewberry also scored that season on an interception.
- Eastern Illinois lost its top two tacklers from last season but the Panthers do return a solid contingent of experienced players on that side of the ball with six of the top ten tacklers returning. Elijawah Tolbert, a first-team All-OVC selection last season at linebacker, is the leading returner with 70 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and three interceptions. Other returning players in the top ten are Nick Coates (67 tackles), Tyris Harvey (34 tackles), Elijah Ball (34 tackles), Phoenix Porter (30 tackles) and Joel Barrows (27 tackles).
- Eastern Illinois defensive backfield is scheduled to welcome back some familiar faces this season after several key players missed time last season due to injury. Russell Dandy and Kaelin Drakeford both played in four games last season due to injury using their NCAA redshirt season. Two years ago Dandy was an All-OVC Newcomer selection. Drakeford was a starter in the Spring 2021 COVID season and 2021 fall season at safety. The Panthers also welcome back safety Blake Ruffin who was on target to be a starter last fall before an injury in camp ended his season.
- Eastern Illinois special teams unit was indeed special last season as the Panthers featured first team All-OVC selections at both kicker and punter with second team selections at long snapper, kick returner and punt returner. Four of those five players return this season with kicker Stone Galloway, long snapper Jack Valente, kick returner Mark Aitken and punt returner Cooper Willman. As a team EIU led the OVC in punt return average, net punting, kick return defense and field goal percentage while ranking third in the conference in kick return average.
- Eastern Illinois offensive line was banged up with injuries last season as the Panthers had eight different starting combinations in their 11 games only starting the same line-up in back-to-back games twice during the season. Of that group, EIU returns eight players that started at least one game last season with veteran offensive lineman Chad Strickland, Anthony Imperio and Jack Valente in their third or more season as starters. Added to that group this off-season was a mixture of new faces with four junior college transfers, three high school players and one four-year transfer in Sebastian Pares.

- Eastern Illinois had its best offensive performances of the season in the first and last games of the 2022 campaign. EIU opened the year with a season high 441 yards of total offense facing defending Mid-American Conference champion Northern Illinois. The Panthers then closed the year with 426 yards of total offense at co-OVC champion and nationally ranked UT Martin. The Panthers posted one other 400 yard game on the season with 408 yards in the OVC opener at Murray State. EIU rushed for 339 yards in that game and then followed up the next week with 340 yards on the ground in a home win over Northwestern State.
- Eastern Illinois will be looking to snap a five-game season opening losing streak when they kickoff the season on Thursday at Indiana State. EIU's last season opening win was in 2017 when the Panthers beat Indiana State 22-20 on a last second touchdown pass. EIU is 1-8 in openers since the 2014 season after EIU had run off a streak of three straight season opening wins in 2011, 2012 and 2013.
- Eastern Illinois defense had 20 turnovers gained last season as the Panthers ranked 29th in the FCS in turnovers gained last year. EIU forced at least one turnover in eight of their 11 games. The defense had 13 interceptions which ranked EIU 16th in the FCS. It marked the fourth time since the 2015 season that EIU finished with 20 or more turnovers gained. The 2015 defense had 31 turnovers and ranked third in the nation. EIU had 20 turnovers gained in 2017 and then 21 turnovers gained in 2019.
- Eastern Illinois was one of the least penalized teams in FCS football last year as the Panthers ranked 11th in the nation and first in the OVC averaging just 37.7 yards per game in penalty yards. EIU's most penalized game last season was against Illinois State in the Mid-America Classic with eight penalties for 72 yards. The Panthers played back-to-back games against Tennessee Tech and McNeese with just one penalty called against EIU and no penalty yards.
- The Ohio Valley Conference and Big South Conference have merged into a joint conference for the sport of football with ten member schools for the 2023 season. The new Big South-OVC Football Association features OVC member schools Eastern Illinois, Lindenwood, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin. The Big South is represented by Charleston Southern and Gardner-Webb with affiliate members Bryant and Robert Morris (Pa.) also playing previously in the Big South. Next season (2024) will again see membership change with Western Illinois joining as a football playing member and Bryant exiting the conference.
- Eastern Illinois has several legacy players on its roster this season with offensive lineman Carson Fichtel, linebacker Jared Pilson and defensive lineman Peyton Wilkerson. Fichtel's father Brad was an All-American lineman for the Panthers in the early 1990's. Pilson's father Jamie was a running back for the Panthers in the early 1990's while Wilkerson's father Chris is the Panthers head coach and a former EIU defensive lineman in the 1990's. All three were teammates under head coach Bob Spoo.
- Eastern Illinois football has expanded its international pool of players as part of their 2023 roster. Already returning to the team was Daniel Luoma who is from Finland and Jaxson Isaac from Canada. The last two seasons Luoma was a reserve tight end and served as the Panthers kickoff specialist averaging 59.2 yards per kick with eight touchbacks in 2021. Isaac, another tight end, joined the roster last season using a redshirt season after playing in four games. Isaac is from Regina, Saskatchewan and played at the College of DuPage in 2021. The newest international Panther is punter Jacob Horvath from Australia. Prior to Luoma the last European player on the EIU roster was Pascal Matla from Holland in the early 2000's. The last EIU player from Canada was Conrad Praamsma in the mid-1990's. The last player from Australia to play for the Panthers was long snapper Bryce Coulson in 2019.
- Eastern Illinois has announced its team captains for the 2023 season with five players in total selected. Mark Aitken (SAF) and Chad Strickland (OL) were voted team captains in the spring following the spring game. Joining that list following fall camp are Justin Thomas (WR), Stone Galloway (K) and Tre'jon Lewis (DL).
- Eastern Illinois football has 12 players on its current roster that already have earned their undergraduate degree as they prepare to play this upcoming season. The seven graduate players are Alex Alteus, Zed Asowata, DeWayne Cooks Jr., Russell Dandy, Juwon Farri, Pierce Holley, Anthony Imperio, Jonah O'Brien, Sebastian Pares, Chad Strickland, Elkhanan Tanelus and Justin Thomas.
- Eastern Illinois offensive lineman Chad Strickland is the Panthers nominee for the NFF Campbell Trophy, the academic Heisman Trophy. Strickland, a preseason All-Big South-OVC Football selection, earned his undergraduate degree in pre-physical therapy with a 3.82 GPA and is currently enrolled in the master's program.

EIU HEAD COACH CHRIS WILKERSON

Chris Wilkerson was hired as the 26th head coach in Eastern Illinois football history on Jan. 26, 2022. A former player and assistant coach at Eastern Illinois, Wilkerson returned home and became the first EIU alumnus to serve as the Panthers head football coach. Wilkerson played and coached under OVC/EIU Hall of Fame Coach Bob Spoo. A 1995 graduate of EIU, Wilkerson coached at EIU until the 2001 season. He had assistant stops at San Jose State and Dartmouth before serving the last ten years as the head coach at the University of Chicago. Wilkerson has a 53-36 career record entering the 2023 season. INDIANA STATE HEAD COACH CURT MALLORY

Curt Mallory, the son of former long time college coach Bill Mallory, enters his seventh season at Indiana State. Mallory posted a 12-22 record in his first three seasons with the Sycamores opting out of the 2020-21 season with COVID-19 concerns. After going 0-11 in his first season the Sycamores improved to 7-4 in year two as he won MVFC Coach of the Year honors. The team was 5-7 during the 2019 campaign. Mallory played football at Michigan and had assistant coaching stops at Indiana, Illinois and Michigan before taking over in Terre Haute. Mallory holds a 19-39 record entering the 2023 season.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE

Indiana State is coming off a 2-9 season which included a 1-7 record in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. Running back Justin Dinka returns after leading the Sycamores ground game last year with 895 yards and six touchdowns. ISU returns all three quarterbacks that saw significant time under center last year passing for more than 1,800 yards. Linebacker Geoffrey Brown and defensive back Rylan Cole were the co-leaders of the defense last season with 84 tackles each.

THE SERIES

Eastern Illinois and Indiana State meet to open the 2023 season as two schools separated by only 45 miles have played 87 times first meeting during the 1901 season. EIU holds a 43-40-4 all-time lead in the series but the Sycamores have won the last three meetings following a six game win streak in the series by EIU. The series history includes one meeting in the 1983 FCS playoffs.

SHUT OUT STREAK ENDS

Eastern Illinois had a 139 game streak of not being shut out in a game end Sept. 12, 2015 at Northwestern during 41-0 loss. The last time EIU had been shut out was Oct. 11, 2003 during a 41-0 loss versus Eastern Kentucky. In the 2015 season opener EIU had its streak of consecutive games scoring a touchdown end at 65 after the Panthers were held out of the end zone. The last time EIU had failed to score a touchdown was October 10, 2009 at Penn State. EIU's longest streak of consecutive games without being shutout was 197 from 1977-1997 which ranks fourth all-time among FCS schools.

Dom Shoffner and Kendi Young both sparked the Eastern Illinois offense while the Panthers defense forced five turnovers in a 35-21 win in the Ohio Valley Conference opener at Murray State. Shoffner entered at quarterback on the second series of the game and never left after leading the Panthers on a long touchdown drive. He would score two rushing touchdowns and pass for a third as the Panthers had 408 yards of total offense. Kendi Young paced the EIU ground game with 160 yards on eight carries including a 36-yard touchdown run at the end of the first half. EIU pounded out 339 yards on the ground, the most since the 2017 season. EIU's defense forced five turnovers with a pair of interceptions by Elijawah Tolbert. Jordan Vincent and Mark Aitken each added a pick.
